durga puja Art an introduction

every autumn, the city of kolkata (formerly calcutta) wakes up to an explosion of creativity, with every neighbourhood decked up in a unique mélange of traditional Art and contemporary concepts, that are diverse and creative enough to rival any international Art biennale but defies comparison by dint of its spread across the city and by being rooted to a religious event. durga puja is bengal's biggest festival that takes place over a week or so in september - october, on varying dates every year. at the centre of the celebration is the figure of goddess durga, crafted traditionally in clay, who is worshipped in the act of vanquishing the demon mahishasura. while the worship of durga and her four divine children remains the ritualistic core, the temporary shelters of the idols - structures created from months in advance in street corners - become exquisite works of artistic expression, unique to each locality every year.






the big salute

the evolution of durga puja of kolkata into an inclusive, community-driven celebration of Art has been hailed by unesco, which describes it as "the best instance of the public performance of religion and Art, and as thriving ground for collaborative artists and designers...".

durga puja was inscribed on unesco's list of intangible cultural heritage of humanity in 2021.






the preview show & us

massArt, an organisation set up in june 2022 with the objective of promoting Art and culture of bengal, identified durga puja as a platform to encourage and enhance indigenous and contemporary Art, culture and heritage and expand their reach to a global arena.

it got its highly competent, experienced and it-enabled team of professionals from different creative and social spheres to work on creating a property that would cater to visitors looking to be introduced to the artistic activity surrounding durga puja.

the socio-culturally inclined not-for-profit organization, registered under the west bengal societies registration act 1961, came up with the idea of a durga puja Art preview show — a centrally managed property that would provide guidance to tourists, bring independent puja organizers on the same page and attract national and international artistic talent to visit, appreciate and even collaborate.




how it works

instead of having viewers crisscross the city in search of quality, a selection is made in advance. from a pool of over 3,500 pujas of different budgets and wildly varying artistic merit, 26 pujas are chosen for the preview show, keeping quality and variety in mind.

registration takes place online at massArt.in entry is ticketed or by invitation.

preview show pass holders get a route map with google map locations, which is invaluable for tourists who might be new to the city.

'making of durga puja Art' an exhibition

alongside the preview show at the puja sites, an exhibition on 'making of durga puja Art' took place during the period at the iconic town hall. the exhibition was a journey through the entire process, from conception to execution, using audiovisual footage and live demonstration. there was also an opportunity to sample the craftsmanship of artistes and collect specimens of their Art before stepping out to enjoy the creations on view at the chosen puja sites.

a bonus was an audio-visual installation which was a result of an indo-german collaboration. 'jol kotha bole I water speaks' had german light and media designer thomas eichhorn and indian sound artist sukanta majumdar joining hands to seek inspiration in the essence of river ganga in india and river elbe in germany through a canvas of light and sound. the artists aimed to connect the stories of these rivers and the lives on their banks thousands of miles apart.

have you been to kolkata before during durga puja?

this is my first durga puja. It's been very exciting, getting to meet the artists and artisans.

would you tell us about your experience and observation on preview show?

for me what makes durga puja so unique is the large scale installation Art. i have seen how communities come together and work for months — artisans from villages, artists, designers, sound artists...

you are seeing this massive crowd on the streets in daytime too and durga puja has not even started. what do you think of the organisational efforts that have been put in to host this festival?

it's amazing that there can be this huge influx of millions of people coming into the city and everything is running so smoothly. massArt has organised the visits of dignitaries at the big installations, managing traffic to ensuring that visitors get to see behind the scenes of work and ensuring everything runs really really smoothly. i just want to say i am overwhelmed.

in the context of the preview show of durga puja Art, you also saw the indo-german installation by sukanta and thomas eichhorn. how did that work add to your experience?

thomas's work specifically has to do with water, it has to do with the scarcity of water, the preciousness of water. it has to do with environmental conservation and that is globally a very important issue. the other thing that i really connected to in that particular installation was the intimacy.

you have been in the city for quite sometime now. tell us about your experience of the city.

i have been in the city almost a month and i am seeing how the city has changed in this last month for the preparation of durga puja. there is something extraordinary about the festival that you cannot understand if you are not here from the mini pictures that you find online, on facebook — how big and how creative it is.

tell us about your understanding of the process of the making of the durga puja

one of the main things that struck me is how it involves all members of the community as well as this continuous innovation that is behind it and the impact that is associated with it. it is extraordinary to see how it really impacts communities in a positive way, especially from the economic point of view.

which aspects attracted or touched you?

i was very impressed with some of the pandals that i have seen so far for the social messages they communicated.

you are experiencing durga puja through massArt's preview show. how is your experience of the massArt intervention?

i think massArt's preview show is a great idea because this way it can facilitate the processing and the understanding of the different pandals and their core messages without facing what is expected to be a big crowd during the festival. i think the main impact of massArt's intervention is to promote durga puja internationally, also to generate new livelihood, encourage more artists in participating as well as giving more recognition to the artists and workers involved in the making of durga puja.

during the preview show we also had an indo-german light and sound show by thomas and sukanta. how did that impact you at the beginning of your durga puja journey?


i found the relationship very thought-provoking because of the metaphor of the water and the river that is continuous and flowing, changing and flexible, creating its own path. it is the same for culture and people.

demographics




